Headlines:

A Sioux Falls man is going to prison for a long time after selling fentanyl leading to the death of a young woman. Twenty-five-year-old Armando Angel Cheshier was sentenced to 21 years yesterday for the 2021 death of 19-year-old Kaylee Teppo. Cheshier was convicted for distribution of a controlled substance resulting in death in 2022. Teppo overdosed after being given both fentanyl and Xanax.

A South Dakota Girl Scout is being praised as a cookie monster of sales. Ten-year-old Junior Girl Scout Cassidy Lawton of Huron is celebrating over six-thousand boxes sold in just three years. This year, she added a twist by learning to speak Spanish to boost her sales. It has helped her sell nearly 25-hundred boxes this season. Lawton and her troop have raised thousands of dollars which goes back to the Huron community.

Police and community members in Hand County are searching extensively for a teenager who went missing in the Miller area. Seventeen-year-old Wyatt Rowland was last seen early Sunday. His phone was last tracked near Lake Louise. He's five-foot-eight with blue eyes and brown hair and could be driving a red 1995 Dodge Dakota pickup. Hand County Sheriff Shane Croeni told KELOLAND News, that about a hundred volunteers assisted in yesterday's search efforts. Anyone with information regarding his whereabouts is urged to contact the Hand County Sheriff's Department.

You'll soon have more opportunities to take your CDL road test in North Dakota. N-DOT is adding six more locations to take the test, bringing the total to 14 testing sites. Watford City, Valley City, Rolla, Grafton, Lisbon, and Wahpeton now have sites available. Previously, tests could only be taken in Williston, Dickinson, Minot, Bismarck, Jamestown, Devils Lake, Grand Forks, and Fargo. N-DOT's director Brad Schaffer says they can now run an additional 50 CDL tests a month and free up their backlog.

United Tribes Technical College is partnering with NDSU for a new Ag Tech program called FARMS, which stands for "Food Systems Adapted for Resiliency and Maximized Security." North Dakota's tribal college system will be awarded 15-million dollars over the next two years to improve agriculture industries and collaboration between higher education institutions in the state. All the tribal colleges will be able to share traditional growing practices and thoughts on food sovereignty and food security on their campuses.

A man accused of leading police on a car chase through Morton County faces several charges. It began Friday night, when Bureau of Indian Affairs agents alerted Morton County deputies to a stolen SUV driving north toward Mandan. Deputies spotted the SUV and a pursuit began, which later ended after the driver slammed on the brakes and two people reportedly jumped out and ran. Deputies used a bloodhound to track one of the suspects to a garage, where they arrested Zane Kelly. He's charged with possessing a stolen vehicle, fleeing, and reckless driving.
